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Mga Dapat Malaman tungkol sa COVID-19



Ano ang COVID-19?

Ang Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) ay isang nakahahawang sakit na dulot ng isang bagong coronavirus na ipinakilala kamakailan sa mga tao sa unang pagkakataon. Tinatawag itong pandemic ng World Health Organization (WHO) dahil kumalat na ang virus sa buong mundo. Halos 80% na tao na may COVID-19 ay may banayad na sintomas.

Ang coronaviruses ay isang malaking pamilya ng virus na nagdudulot ng iba't ibang sakit, mula sa karaniwang ubo't sipon hanggang sa mas malubhang mga impeksyon tulad ng MERS-CoV at SARS-CoV. Ang coronavirus ay maaari ring magdulot ng iba't ibang sakit sa mga hayop.

Ano ang mga sintomas ng COVID-19?

Maaari ring makaranas ang mga pasyente ng iba pang sintomas gaya ng sakit ng lalamunan, pagbabara ng ilong (nasal congestion), sakit ng ulo, pagtatae, pagkahilo at pagsusuka, at kawalan ng pang-amoy (anosmia) o panlasa (ageusia) bago pa man makaranas ng mga respiratory symptoms.



Paano naipapasa and COVID-19?



Ito ay naipapasa ng tao-sa-tao sa pamamagitan ng droplets. Naipapasa ito mula sa mga malilit na talsik ng laway (droplet) mula sa pagsasalita, pagbahing, o pag-ubo ng isang taong may COVID-19. Ang mga droplet na ito ay nalalanghap ng ibang tao.

Ito ay karaniwang nangyayari sa mga taong may malapitang pakikisalamuha sa may sakit – tulad ng mga kapamilya at healthcare workers kaya mariing pinapayo na panatilihin ang isang metrong layo sa mga taong may sintomas tulad ng pag-ubo at pagbahing.

Nakakukuha rin ang isang tao ng COVID-19 kapag humawak sa mga bagay o rabaw (surface) at saka hahawak sa kaniyang mata, ilong, o bibig. Kaya napakahalaga na palaging maghugas ng iyong kamay.

DILG MANDATE

The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) is committed to promote peace and order, ensure public safety, and strengthen local governance aimed towards the effective delivery of basic services to the citizenry.

The Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism Program Management Office (PCVE PMO) was created to link and harmonize the different initiatives of the DILG bureaus, attached agencies and other national government agencies and stakeholders in addressing violent extremism and other threats to national security.

DILG as the Lead Agency to the NAP PCVE

The Anti-Terrorism Council, the main policy making body for the government's anti-terrorism efforts has designated the DILG as the lead agency through Anti-Terrorism Council Resolution No. 38 entitled "Adoption of the National Action Plan on Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism (NAP P/CVE) and its Organizational Structure", it will ensure the implementation of the NAP P/CVE through the relevant National Government Agencies and key stakeholders.



National Action Plan on Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism (NAP P/CVE)

The NAP PCVE through Anti-Terrorism Council Resolution No. 38 is guided by international standards and conventions particularly on human rights, rule of law and international humanitarian law. It is comprehensive, inclusive and gender-sensitive.

It is a whole-of-nation initiative that embodies the commitments of the national and local government, civil society organizations, and other key stakeholders to address the factors of violent extremism.

It is designed to strengthen the resiliency of the Filipinos against violent extremism, and it aims to prevent any future involvement of citizens in harmful activities.

What is Violent Extremism?

United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy states that violent extremism is a diverse phenomenon, without a clear definition. It is neither new nor exclusive to any region, nationality or system of belief.

The Philippines, through Anti-Terrorism Act of 2020, defines terrorism as engaging in acts intending to: (a) cause death or serious bodily injury to any person, or endangers a person's life; (b) cause extensive damage or destruction to a government or public facility, public place or private property; (c) cause extensive interference with, damage or destruction to critical infrastructure; (d) develop, manufacture, possess, acquire, transport, supply or use weapons, explosives or of biological, nuclear, radiological or chemical weapons; OR (e) release of dangerous substances, or causing fire, floods or explosions.

These two elements of **VIOLENT ACT** and **VIOLENT PURPOSE** must be present for an act to be considered as terrorism.

The Anti-Terror Law expressly excludes legitimate exercises of the freedom of expression and to peaceably assemble, including but not limited to engaging in advocacy, protest, dissent, mass action and other similar exercises which are not intended to cause death or serious physical harm to a person, to endanger a person's life, or to create a serious risk to public safety. This exercise of constitutional rights WILL NEVER and SHALL NEVER be considered as a terrorist act.

The NAP P/CVE and Republic Act No. 11479 or "Anti-Terrorism Act of 2020"

The ATA of 2020 will engage the rapidly evolving threats of terrorism, as well as address its drivers and spreading through preventing and countering violent extremism measures.

It institutionalizes and supports the implementation of the NAP P/CVE. It is a crucial tool to enhance the government's efforts to fight terrorism and protect its people from harm.

Considering the latest passage of Anti-Terrorism Law, it is important to look at the complementation the ATA of 2020 to NAP PCVE:

Section 45 of RA 11479:

"The Anti-Terrorism Council shall formulate and adopt comprehensive, adequate, efficient, and effective plans, programs or measures to prevent, counter, suppress or eradicate the commission of terrorism in the country and to protect the people from such acts."

Section 46 of RA 11479:

"Coordinate all national efforts to suppress and eradicate terrorism in the country; Establish and maintain coordination with and the cooperation and assistance of other states, jurisdictions, international entities and organizations in preventing and combatting terrorism."





The CBRN National Team

The NAP CBRN includes the reconstitution of the National CBRN Team that shall provide technical expertise and support for the implementation of the NAP CBRN. DILG shall be the lead agency, while the ATC-Program Management Center (ATC-PMC) shall act as secretariat and coordinator of the National CBRN Team.

Its functions are to assist in developing government policy guidelines on CBRN; assist in monitoring the implementation and execution of the NAP CBRN and related activities; conduct periodic assessment and workshop activities that will reduce the country's vulnerabilities to CBRN threats; engage academe and civil society to undertake empirical research on CBRN; and review the NAP CBRN every two years, as necessary.



What is CBRN?

CBRN an acronym for Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and commonly used in discussions on hazardous materials. threat/risk reduction and emergency attacks.

CHEMICAL WEAPONS

These four matters are high risk materials that have a great potential to be weaponized for harm and destruction. Examples of CBRN incidents are (a) deliberate dumping or release of hazardous materials, (b) malicious poisoning of one or more individuals, and (c) other terrorist acts (as defined in the Anti-Terrorism Act of 2020) that involve serious violence to persons or property for a political, religious or ideological purpose and/or that are a matter of national interest.



National Action Plan on Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear (NAP CBRN)

Vision

A nation safe and secure from CBRN security incidents.

Mission

To reduce the threat of, and damage from CBRN security incidents

Strategic Objectives

- A. Establish a system of sustainable National CBRN policies, programs, standards, training, and concepts.
- B. Create an effective, modernized, and inter-operable group among agencies that will respond to all CBRN threats and incidents (NATIONAL CBRN TEAM)
- Limit accessibility to high risk CBRN materials
- D. Strengthen and enhance local, regional, and international cooperation in the field of CBRN security

Cross Cutting Objectives

- A. Create the CBRN National Emergency Preparedness, Response and Recovery Plan
- B. Fulfill obligations to international CBRN conventions/agreements/treaties related
- C. Increase knowledge and promote public awareness on CBRN threats and risks
- D. Strengthen capacities of regulatory bodies to deal with high risk CBRN materials
- E. Promote regional and international cooperation
